We learn

ECC

Wuxi's Early Childhood Center is a vibrant and joyful community that values every child. One of the key aspects of our program is purposeful play, which research has shown to be crucial for young students' social-emotional, physical and cognitive development. Our teachers model the use of real-world materials and tools, allowing students to explore learning themes in mathematics, literacy and science. They also practice verbal language and problem-solving skills both indoors and outdoors.

Elementary

The elementary program supports the individualized learning styles of each child providing opportunities for specialized enrichment programs in music, art, physical education, language and technology ensuring a well-rounded education.















Leadership

Leadership is a key aspect of the program, as students learn problem-solving and critical thinking skills through active participation in the learning process. Teachers and students ask questions, explore and investigate together, fostering skillful communication in written, verbal and aesthetic forms of expression. Students also learn to make wise choices in leading themselves and their peers.

Fifth Grade Transitions Program

Transitioning into middle school can be challenging. Many students find that the increased workload, mounting responsibilities along with added social-emotional stress makes transitioning into middle school a confusing and difficult experience. Our Transitions Program prepares students for the transition into middle school. Grade 5 students are in self-contained homeroom for the first semester with content teachers traveling to their homerooms to deliver instruction. At the start of the second semester, students travel to different classrooms to receive content instruction. FLEX time is available during the day. This time is also used as a study hall and a time to receive extra academic support if needed.

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Middle School

The middle school program is designed with the understanding that students in grades six through eight need opportunities to maximize learning. Students have opportunities to explore concepts and demonstrate content knowledge across the curriculum. Integrated instructional approaches using STEM concepts provide students with varied and rich educational experiences giving them access to guided student inquiry, dialogue and critical thinking.

Technology

Each middle school student has access to an electronic school issued device. Technology is integrated into the middle school curriculum, enhancing students' research, communication and collaboration skills. Students learn appropriate 21st century technology skills and essential digital citizenship skills that prepare them for a technologically integrated world.

CCA Program

At Wuxi, co-curricular activities are essential to education beyond the classroom. These activities give our students the opportunity to expand their learning and creativity while developing their confidence, as all are encouraged to get involved and explore their interests. We find that students who are involved in co-curriculars are more invested in their school experience, in turn leading to higher academic performance, social well-being and leadership development.



High School

The Secondary program provides a holistic curriculum that balances the development of concepts, skills and character. There is a focus on guided inquiry, collaboration and communication as approaches to teaching and learning.

STEM

Students meet twice a week for a project-based STEM class that focuses on hands-on activities in construction, 3D printing and exploring how things work in the new STEM lab.

Student well-being and safety

At Wuxi, we recognize that students are not purely academic beings. For this reason, we have social-emotional counselors. These staff members have training in supporting teachers and coaching students through the challenges that they face.






Additionally, we focus on helping our children develop the skills needed to interact well with those around them. The Second Step program for social-emotional learning runs through the elementary and secondary programs. Second Step helps students develop maturity in handling feelings, resolving conflicts and making healthy friendships. Through games, songs, videos and role playing, students explore such issues as bullying, abuse prevention, cooperation and relationship building, all in age-appropriate sessions. Child Safety and Protection instruction occurs annually in all departments at International School of Wuxi.

Keeping our community safe and secure is a top priority. Every quarter, emergency drills are organized for the students so that they are prepared in the event of an incident. Emergency drills include fire safety, intruder lockdowns and earthquake drills. The school also actively encourages learning beyond the classroom through field trips and taking part in external competitions. Our safety vetting process of arranging a trip outside of school involves a rigorous process of checks, walk-throughs and approvals to ensure that student safety is preserved at all times. Every year, staff receive First Aid and CPR training to ensure student safety. The school nurse monitors and reports the AQI level three times a day. The level of physical activity is restricted if the AQI level is high.

International Day

International Day is a favorite around Wuxi. The day begins with a parade of all the different classes dressed in traditional clothes of the country their class represents. Once the parade is over, everyone meets in the gym to learn about and experience different cultures. Students from Grade 1 through Grade 12 host other classes and share what they've learned about the country they've studied. This year, we were able to have visitors from outside our school community visit to celebrate International Day with us!



6 kilometers is the average distance a person in the developing world must walk to find water—water that is often not safe to drink or wash their hands with. Our community was able to raise awareness and funds to provide clean water for those in the developing world. Even though it was a hot, sunny day, we were so glad to participate in this event!

LifePlus 5K May Challenge

Many in the Wuxi community participated in the 5K May Challenge. The challenge called for 5 kilometers of movement a day whether walking, running, swimming, cycling, etc. People from all over LifePlus were encouraged to get out and move every day for the month of May and share their experiences!



ISW Change-Makers Club

Last year, Wuxi high school students started a club with the goal of making a positive impact within our city. This club met every week and brainstormed different ways they could accomplish that goal.

Our Change-Makers Club participated in the clean-up campaign with a focus on saving the planet by recycling. Our Change-Makers Club, together with a local foreign company and Wuxi Korean School's Change-Makers Club cleaned up the area around the lake near a popular tourist attraction in Wuxi.




How we intend to grow
